You'll also find details on remote opportunities, salary information, and the projected tech job growth for each state. The Computer Technology Industry Association (CompTIA)—a non-profit IT certifying body released a report that highlights the net tech employment numbers for all 50 states and the District of Columbia.

- The percentage of remote tech jobs.
- Net employment as the percentage of each state's overall workforce.
- The projected 10-year tech job outlook for each state.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the outlook for tech jobs is looking good. The tech jobs with the highest projected growth over the next ten years include:

- Computer and information research scientist jobs 21%

1. California

From San Diego to Silicon Valley, California is a goldmine for people looking for tech jobs. It's not only among the states with the most tech jobs in the U.S., it's No. 1. Home to **four national labs** and 16 of America's best cybersecurity programs, California has the largest concentration of **high-paying tech companies** and jobs in the U.S.




